Ospreys In Verse – Ideas for English teachers (Primary)

Verse and rhyme are an exciting way to use words.

Introduction

1. Begin with some osprey images or some osprey video clips showing their activities.

Discussion

- 2. Describe what they have seen or the video they watched
- 3. What do ospreys look like and what did the ospreys do?
- 4. Build up a list of descriptive words they could use in their verse

Making the Verse

To help to give the children a way of writing verse try to make each line begin with a letter. It is easier to begin without rhyme. Faster workers could then try a version in rhyme
