Welcome to Day 2 of World Osprey Week! Now that you have learned all about ospreys, today is your chance to find out about the story of ospreys in the UK.














HISTORICAL TIMELINE

10 - 15 million years ago: fossil discoveries show ospreys existed!



1609:

Shakespeare mentions ospreys in one of his plays he must have seen ospreys himself!



1847: ospreys became **locally extinct** in England and Wales.

Did you know: ospreys didn't breed in England for over 150 years!

1200 - 165 BC: the Old Testament mentions ospreys among birds not to eat.

I think he'll be to Rome, as is the osprey to the fish, who takes it by sovereignty of nature

1700 - 1900:Ospreys were killed by humans.



1916: ospreys became **locally extinct** in Scotland.

REWILDLING BRITAIN'S SKIES

Thankfully, ospreys can be found in most countries across the world. Over the years following their extinction as a breeding bird in the UK, ospreys were still seen in our skies in the spring and autumn. It was some of these birds that helped save the ospreys in Britain!



A really exciting project was given the go-ahead to help ospreys in England. (learn more about this on Day 4 of WOW)

A really promising year for UK ospreys! The first pair successfully raised chicks in Scotland near Loch Garten. The ospreys were originally from Scandinavia eg Norway.

Ospreys nested for the first time in Wales, in the Glaslyn Valley (Glaslyn Ospreys). In 2005 they celebrated their first 2 chicks!

A new pair of ospreys bred in Cumbria at Foulshaw Moss (Cumbria Wildlife Trust) who successfully raised 2 chicks!

A new osprey project began at Poole Harbour, Dorset, to help ospreys in the south of England (Birds of Poole Harbour). Another exciting project to keep your eyes on!

The UK now has between 300 and 400 breeding pairs of ospreys, most of which can be found in Scotland.


